Local Member repeats calls for safe water for Bullsbrook 01 September 2021

- Swan Hills MLA Jessica Shaw repeats calls for Morrison Government to support PFAS affected residents in West Bullsbrook
- · West Bullsbrook residents left abandoned by stopgap solutions
- · Quarantine facility provides opportunity to fix underlying problem

Member for Swan Hills Jessica Shaw MLA has repeated her call for a federally-funded, reticulated water solution for PFAS affected residents, to accompany the quarantine facility slated for construction in Bullsbrook.

The Department of Defence has admitted it has contaminated drinking water sources for properties in the area surrounding the RAAF Base Pearce with the toxic chemical solution per- and poly-fluoroalkyl (PFAS). In 2019, a bipartisan Senate Committee determined that the Commonwealth should take financial responsibility to rectify the situation.

Ms Shaw has been working with community representatives to demand that the Federal Government rectifies the harm it has caused. As far back as 2019, the State Government has supported a solution for a Commonwealth-funded scheme water connection.

The Federal Government has ignored community pleas for a permanent, safe water supply solution, instead relying on stop gap solutions, including providing boxed water to residents.

The Federal Government has now slated the Bullsbrook Training Area as the preferred site for a 1000 bed WA Centre for National Resilience and has indicated that the quarantine facility would not use groundwater, presenting the Morrison Government with an opportunity to deliver safe drinking water for West Bullsbrook.

Ms Shaw said "After years of fighting, we are still waiting for the Federal Government to fix the problem they created. Scott Morrison should stop avoiding responsibility and instead take this opportunity to rectify the harm caused to the people of West Bullsbrook.

"The Department of Defence is responsible for the PFAS pollution in West Bullsbrook and under the polluter pays framework, justice demands that the Commonwealth resolves this issue.

"All Western Australians have a right to safe drinking water. For years now, I have advocated that the best solution would be to extend the scheme water system to West Bullsbrook.

I continue to urge the Morrison Government and the Department of Defence to do the right thing."

The State Government has committed to providing help and assistance to the Department of Defence to facilitate the extension of scheme water to West Bullsbrook. Representatives from the Water Corporation met with personnel from the Department of Defence in August 2020 to provide input into a conceptual plan to connect properties in West Bullsbrook to scheme water.

The project has already been costed as part of these conceptual plans, and expected costs are in the order of \$7 million to \$9 million – a drop in the ocean for the Commonwealth Government.
